



INVESTMENT INCENTIVES

Botswana's Corporate Tax Rate is Highly Competitive

TAXATION

15% for Manufacturing, IFSC, Innovation Hub 5 -10% for SPEDU Region Special Economic Zones

Maximum 22% for Other Sectors

Value Added Tax at 14% Maximum 25% Personal Income Tax Possible tax holidays



SECTOR CHALLENGES

- Covid-19 pandemic
- Inadequate monitoring of Education policies and programmes inplementation
- Weak institutional and industry linkages
- Inadequate supply of qualified vocational and technical staff in relevant fields
- Inadequate funding for Research and Innovation in both sectors
- Diversion of development funds and resources to enable and promote the sectors
- Relatively high cost of computers
- Absence of electricity in a number of rural areas
- Expensive internet usage

- There are ample unemployed graduates in Botswana who are trainable
- Botswana has put in place various enabling policy and regulatory frameworks for sector development
- There is continuous sector support and upgrades in infrastructure development by the government of Botswana and the private sector
- ICT and Education sectors are core to the Post Covid-19 National Economic Transformation and Recovery Plan (ETRP)

- Advocacy and policy review
- Continuous engagement between industry and institutions for development of future proof value chains and linkages
